Description of Project: Most experts acknowledge that severe disruptions to the NAS cost the airlines millions of dollars a year in revenues each year. But there are many issues not completely understood about



a "severe disruption." First, what constitutes a severe disruption? Can it be defined by an event, a duration of an event or a certain level of minimal performance. Second, when do airlines seek to mitigate the effects of a severe disruption and enter into a phase of "irregular operations". The project focused on how does an airline estimate the cost and loss of revenue associated with irregular operations due to severe disruptions.
